# Governing Board Members' Update

Eastland-Fairfield Career & Technical Schools

Mrs. Galbraith and Mrs. Glitt reported on an excellent performance at the recent EFCTS Board meeting by students in the Performing Arts program. They also reported that an 80-year EFCTS student recently earned her GED in order for her to serve as a volunteer that required a high school degree.

Delaware Area Career Center

Mr. Bischoff reported that the new DACC facility is being heavy used by outside entities to hold meetings. He also reported that there have been minimal problems with the building following construction. Mr. Bischoff informed the Board he would like to hold an ESC of Central Ohio Governing Board meeting at DACC after the first of the year.

Treasurer's Update

Mr. Varda updated Board members on the current status of the performance reviews of ESCs by the Auditor of State Office. There has been a delay due to the change in State leadership, but the Auditor's Office has been gearing up to begin the process with projected completion in March for submission to the State Legislature.

Mr. Varda reported that the staff from the Office of Human Resources and the Payroll Department will working on the implementation of the new W-4 form that will be used for new staff hired after January 1, 2020. The new form is not yet available, but the ESC has learned it is a more complicated form.

Ohio Healthcare Consortium Update

Board members were informed by Mr. Varda that he recently attended a Board meeting and reported that all of the ESCCO's plans are doing very well as they are within the prescribed necessary reserves.

Superintendent's Update

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that he recently attended a meeting hosted by Dr. Harrison, President of Columbus State Community College, along with other Franklin County Superintendents. Dr. Harrison shared a prospective bond issue fact sheet with the attendees regarding a proposed bond issue of under one mill for capital improvements of the College's facilities in Franklin County. CSCC is considering placing the issue on the March 2020 ballot.

Dr. Goodney distributed a draft of the ESCCO's Request for Information from school improvement technical assistance providers.
