Governing Board Members' Update

Eastland-Fairfield Career & Technical Schools

Mr. Lopez reported that only administrative and personnel matters were dealt with at the recent EFCTS Board meeting.

Delaware Area Career Center

Mrs. Hanson reported that Mr. Paul Fallon, public opinion research and pollster, from Fallon Research and Communications, Inc. was in attendance at the recent DACC Board meeting. He presented very interesting results and statistics as the result of a recent poll he conducted in the Delaware community on their perceptions of the Career Center.

Treasurer's Update

Mr. Varda reported that two new fiscal positions have been filled through the ESC Council of Governments to support the increasing work with both the EANS grant and the Franklin County Family and Children First Council. Interviews for the position of EANS Consultant will be held next week. Mr. Varda also informed Board members that eligibility requirements and funding amounts are being determined by the Ohio Department of Education for a second round of EANS funding.

Ohio Healthcare Consortium Update No items to report.

Superintendent's Update

Dr. Goodney updated Board members on the Extended Learning Grant the Ohio Department of Education with be offering to educational service centers. Progress is being made on the ESCCO's proposal that will be very bold and comprehensive. The estimated \$36 million, if approved, will be used in the areas of student services, curriculum/training, technology/digital learning, operational/business support services and management/coordination. Dr. Goodney informed Board members that he expects 3-1/2 positions will be needed for the management of this work.

Dr. Goodney reported that the ESCCO is continuing to conduct the search for a new Executive Director of the Franklin County Family and Children First Council. The next round of interviews will take place at the end of the October by a panel that includes representatives from the FCFC Council, the Franklin County Board of Developmental Disabilities, ADAMH Board of Franklin County, Franklin County Job and Family Services and a parent representative.

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that the ESCCO is in search for a new site for the Delaware County Ventures program beginning with the 2022-2023 school year. The Delaware County Commissioners are planning to sell the property currently housing the program. Mr. Trego is working with a commercial realtor to find a new building.

Dr. Goodney discussed the possibilities to use the estimated \$600,000 to \$1 million in GEER funds and is recommending hiring staff members in the area of Early Childhood and student well-being.

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that he has been contacted by the Superintendent of Columbus City Schools seeking assistance in area of career and technical programs. Dr. Goodney is recommended that Christine Galvin, ESCCO Director of College and Career Success, be assigned to use some of her time assisting Columbus City Schools in this area and assist them in finding a permanent solution to manage their programs.

Dr. Goodney reported that he recently met with Dr. Antoinette Miranda, Chair of the School Psychology Program in The Ohio State University Department of Teaching and Learning, to discuss a collaboration. As a result of OSU eliminating their graduate student stipends, Dr. Goodney asked for the Board members' support of a program to cover the tuition and living stipends for four

School Psychology students for two years of their studies. The students would be working for the ESCCO during those two years and then in exchange for covering their tuition and stipend, they would sign an agreement to work at the ESCCO for three years. Having additional School Psychologists available would be of great help to our client school districts. This program could start as early as the 2022 Spring Semester.

Dr. Goodney updated the Board on the search being conducted by the ESC of Central for a new Superintendent for Whitehall City Schools under the direction of Dr. Dan Good.
