Governing Board Members' Update

Eastland-Fairfield Career & Technical Schools

Mr. Alcock reported that the EFCTS Board met last week. An update on the Purple Star Program was presented to the Board. This program recognizes the military parents of students who are deployed and offers programs and services to these EFCTS families. Construction contracts were also approved by the Board for the additions to both EFCTS school buildings. Mr. Alcock also reported that the custodians and cafeteria workers narrowly approved to unionize.

Delaware Area Career Center No items to report.

Treasurer's Update

Mr. Varda informed Board members that Jolene Carter, ESCCO Assistant Treasurer, is leaving at the end of the month. She has accepted the position of Treasurer at Marion City Schools. Ms. Carter's duties will be covered by a current staff member who is being promoted to cover the Franklin County Family and Children Services work. Mr. Varda and Mr. Weaver will share the duties to cover the work for our sponsored Community Schools.

Ohio Healthcare Consortium Update

Mr. Varda reported that open benefit enrollment has been completed for the benefits that go into effect on January 1. Finalization of the selection of Stop/Loss coverage will be discussed at the Consortium's meeting next week.

Superintendent's Update

Dr. Goodney reviewed two grant opportunities from the Department of Higher Education in the area of computer science and from the Department of Education and Workforce Development to elevate sustainability of initiatives related to learning loss at the end of ESSER Grant Funds.

Dr. Goodney reported that as a result of the new Department of Education and Workforce now being in place, ODE will no longer oversee early childhood programs. This will be done by the new Department of Children and Youth and will affect the ESCCO's early childhood preschool program.

The Ohio Senate will hold its hearing to vote on the appointment of Steve Dackin as the Director of the new Department of Education and Workfoce.in early December. Mr. Dackin is planning on attending the December Central Ohio Superintendents' Association meeting at the ESCCO. Dr. Goodney updated the Board on education legislation that is currently at a standstill in the Ohio House of Representatives.

Dr. Goodney and Mr. Varda reviewed the procedure for appointment a new Governing Board member to fill the current vacancy. The announcement of the vacancy will be listed on the ESCCO's website.

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that he and Dr. Kellogg recently met with representatives from Adept, a marketing company, that presented a possible campaign strategy to address the teacher shortage issue. Dr. Goodney reviewed Adept's presentation included a mission to raise awareness about the shortages in Ohio, increase enrollment in teaching programs, showcase the impact that teachers have in our communities and encouraging people to explore teaching as a profession at various stages of life. The presentation also included suggestions on how to solve the problem, how to engage the right partners and program budget.
