7.01/Items for the Board's Information and Review

- **Governing Board Members' Update**

Delaware Area Career Center

Mrs. Hanson reported that a representative from the Inspire School Program was in attendance at the last DACC Board meeting to present on this Social and Emotional Learning mentoring program. The meeting also included a presentation on the new DACC adult learning for the deaf program, DACC's 5-year forecast, the most recent ODE report card and the addition of four new programs at the Career Center.

Eastland-Fairfield Career & Technical Schools

Mr. Lopez reported that there was an impressive presentation on the Pre-Engineering program at the Career Center. Mrs. Glitt informed Board members that the students completing this program are receiving good job offers right out of high school. Mr. Lopez informed Board members that the EFCTS open houses at both campuses are worthwhile events to attend and informed Board members they are scheduled on December 2, 2021 from 6 to 8 p.m.

- **Treasurer's Update**

Mr. Varda provided Board members with an update on the audit process. The auditors are currently working offsite and are provided access to the ESCCO's financial system to access all records. The filing of the GAAP financial statements is expected to take place on November 29, 2021. The auditors will come onsite for a couple of days to finalize the audit.

- **Ohio Healthcare Consortium Update**

Mr. Varda reported that the Consortium Board met recently to finalize the stop-loss coverage for the upcoming year. He also informed Board members that the Wellness Insurance Committee lead by Rick Bailey, Director of Human Resources, held their recent meeting at the Easton Marathon clinic. Plans to find a wellness program provide for the ESCCO were discussed.

- **Superintendent's Update**

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that the Whitehall City Schools superintendent search, lead by Dr. Dan Good for the ESCCO, has concluded with the position being offered to Sharee Wells, former ESC Director of Professional Learning and the current Assistant Superintendent at Hilliard City Schools. There were thirty applicants for the position and six candidates were chosen to be interviewed. The contract is being finalized and the Whitehall Board of Education expects to vote on it at their December 6, 2021 Board meeting.

Dr. Goodney provided Board members with an update on the Extended Learning Grant and reported the ESCCO's application has been filed. Dr. Goodney recently shared his vision with the State Superintendent on how the funds would be spent to assist the ESCCO's client school districts and to continue to support ODE initiatives.

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that Ann Lockett, formerly of Columbus and Westerville City Schools, has been hired as the Director to lead Early Childhood initiatives at the ESCCO. Ms. Lockett brings a wealth of experience in this area to our agency.

Dr. Goodney reported that two ESCCO staff members received Teamwork Awards at the OESCA award event held in conjunction with the OSBA Capital Conference. Dr. Tom Reed was recognized for his extensive work assisting OESCA and Mrs. Barbara Harden was recognized for her work as serving as a liaison with the Ohio Department of Health and coordinating the distribution personal protective equipment/supplies to Central Ohio school districts during the pandemic.

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that the ESCCO coordinated the interview process to fill the position of Executive Director of the Franklin County Family and Children Council. Veronica Brady, currently the Executive Director of the Family and Children Council in Logan County, has been selected to fill the position.
