

Franklin County COVID-19 Vaccination Program for School Staff

Registration for Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine appointments through Kroger Health will be made available Sunday, January 31.

Franklin County COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Details

Who is Eligible?

- Employees identified by Franklin County districts and schools selected/assigned to Kroger Health as their vaccination partner
- *Note: You could receive the registration link from a district/agency you are currently assigned to as well. Either link will be fine to use.*

When are the Clinics?

- Clinics for 1st dose will begin Tuesday, February 2 and end Saturday, February 6
- Appointments will be between 12pm-8pm Tuesday-Friday and 9am-5pm Saturday
- Clinics for 2nd dose begin Tuesday, February 23 and end Saturday, February 27 (same hours)

Where are the Clinics? (See aerial maps attached)

- Hilliard-Davidson High School (Field House) | 5100 Davidson Road, Hilliard, OH 43026
- Reynoldsburg High School (Livingston Campus) | 6699 East Livingston Avenue, Reynoldsburg, OH 43068

What to Bring:

- Government issued ID
- Teacher/Staff ID, or proof of employment, such as an official letter from the district/school (see attached)
- Insurance/Pharmacy Card

Day of Event:

- Arrive 15 minutes prior to your scheduled appointment time
- Wear layers to easily allow for access to arm

- Second doses will be scheduled on site for the week beginning February 23 (same day, same time, 21 days later)
- Those vaccinated will be asked to wait for observation for 15 minutes
 - 30 minutes if history of anaphylaxis
- In addition to educational materials, takeaways will include a COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card

If you've already had Covid-19, should you get the COVID-19 vaccine?

- Yes, once recovered. Due to the severe health risks associated with COVID19 and the fact that reinfection with COVID-19 is possible, you should be vaccinated regardless of whether you already had COVID-19 infection. If you were treated for COVID-19 symptoms with monoclonal antibodies or convalescent plasma, you should wait 90 days before getting a COVID-19 vaccine. (Reference: CDC)
- If you are quarantined due to an active COVID-19 infection or quarantined due to a close contact, even if you do not have symptoms or have not tested positive, you are not eligible to be vaccinated until no longer under quarantine.
