### Items for the Board's Information and Review

### Governing Board Members' Update

Eastland-Fairfield Career & Technical Schools

Mrs. Galbraith reported that the EFCTS Board held a brief meeting last
Wednesday with no audience in attendance.

Delaware Area Career Center

Mr. Bischoff reported that the DACC Board held a short meeting last Thursday. Ms. Mary Beth Freeman, DACC Superintendent, updated Board members on the progress and ongoing planning for online classes for their students. Mr. Bischoff also reported that many of the windows in the new building are leaking and the contractor is in the progress of fixing the problem during the school closure.

### Treasurer's Update

Mr. Varda reported that the ESCCO's client school CFO/Treasurers will be meeting via Zoom this upcoming Tuesday for the second time since schools were ordered closed to assist them with fiscal and closure issues. The first meeting was very well received. The Ohio Department of Education will also have staff participating in this upcoming meeting to discuss topics related to the closure.

Mr. Varda informed Board members that several of his staff members have been designated as essential and will be working a limited number of hours each week physically in the office to perform essential tasks needed in the areas of accounts receivable/payable and payroll that cannot be completed from home.

### Ohio Healthcare Consortium Update

Mr. Varda reported that TeleDoc, that was already available, and opportunities for virtual doctor office visits approved by Allied Benefit Systems are in place for use by ESCCO staff.

### Superintendent's Update

Dr. Goodney informed Board members of the outstanding work being done by David Varda, Mike Trego and David Weaver in response to the current situation. He also commended Lori Dray and the technology team for the excellent work to help our staff and client school districts. The need for the ESCCO team to be innovative and inventive is vital right now to assist our school districts and partners. OESCA is holding weekly meetings for all ESC Superintendents to discuss a variety of current issues including ESCs stepping up to provide more work in the area of remote learning.

Dr. Goodney informed Board members that the Ohio Legislature passed HB 197 with strong bipartisan support. Governor DeWine is expected to sign it today and no line item vetoes are expected. Dr. Goodney highlighted the education provisions in the bill such as allowances virtual board meetings, early childhood education, continuation of food service programs for students, the elimination of testing and district report cards for the 2019-20 school year, permit services to be delivered electronically or via telehealth to students with special needs, extends licensure deadlines to 90 days after the emergency ends, allow students to graduate who were on track to do so as determined by the school districts. The ESCCO will work with school districts in providing services to help the students who are severely at risk for not graduating.

Dr. Goodney asked Mr. Trego to develop a rationale for determining who are the essential staff needed to perform critical work in the office during the closure period in the areas of finance, leadership and the support of distant learning for client school districts. The majority of staff are working remotely in accordance with the Governor's stay at home order. The limited number of staff deemed essential must take their temperature before coming in the office and follow all the social distancing and hygiene practices recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. If the Governor extends the stay at home order, Mr. Trego will revisit who needs to be deemed essential to enter ESCCO buildings. Dr. Goodney has also asked the administrative team to provide him with a list of everything their Centers are doing to assist school districts.
