### JOIN THE NEXT COHORT

Beginning in January, we are launching a STEM+ FOR ALL cohort focused on supporting individuals who seek to change their careers to be intervention specialist teachers. Each prospective teacher will receive ongoing training and mentoring, along with financial support, to obtain licensure as a K-12 moderate-intensive intervention specialist.



## PUT YOUR PLAN INTO ACTION

Applications to the online graduate program in Special Education for students with moderate-intensive educational needs are accepted through one central online application portal at <https://www.ohio.edu/graduate/apply>. Application materials include two letters of recommendation, a writing sample of two pages indicating your commitment to teaching and highlighting your knowledge and/or accomplishments in STEM+ fields, and unofficial transcripts from your Baccalaureate degree program. The priority deadline is December 1 and the absolute deadline is January 1. Because space is limited in this program, applicants are encouraged to apply by the priority deadline.

## MASTER'S IN EDUCATION WITH LICENSURE IN MODERATE-INTENSIVE INTERVENTION SPECIALIST

- 17 months of training and mentorship from faculty and mentor teachers in intervention specialist and STEM fields
- 18 courses and 1 action research project
- 2 practicum experiences and 1 year-long internship in the greater Columbus vicinity
- 2 years of ongoing post-graduation support

### BENEFITS OF THE STEM+ FOR ALL PROGRAM

#### Commitments

Upon graduation, we are committed to:

- Assisting you in securing employment as a moderate-intensive intervention specialist
- Providing you with two years of follow-up support as a new teacher
- Supporting your credentialing in computer information and technology

Upon graduation, you are committed to:

- Teaching students with moderate-intensive needs for at least three years or repaying the stipend(s) you received
- Participating in ongoing professional development that we provide to strengthen your teaching effectiveness

#### Financial Aid

Prospective teachers in the STEM+ FOR ALL program receive the following financial supports:

- Stipend up to \$27,450 to offset the cost-of-living expenses while completing the program
- Stipend up to \$8,000 in TEACH Grant funding
- Additional federal financial aid based on financial need
- Limited number of full scholarships to cover program tuition and fees available for qualifying students
